



Michael G. Stewart, MD, MPH

Dr. Stewart is Professor and Chairman of the Department of Otolaryngology-Head & Neck Surgery at Weill Cornell Medical College. He also serves as Vice Dean of the Medical College, and as Otolaryngologist-in-Chief at NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital/Weill Cornell Medical Center. He received a B.E. degree summa cum laude from Vanderbilt University, and an M.D. from Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. He completed residency training at Baylor College of Medicine, and received his M.P.H. degree from the University of Texas School of Public Health, Houston.

Dr. Stewart's clinical practice is general otolaryngology, and he has particular interest in nose and sinus disease. He is the author of 2 textbooks, and more than 30 book chapters and 110 peer-reviewed publications. He is Editor-in-Chief of *The Laryngoscope*, and previously served as Associate Editor and on Editorial Boards of several other journals. He is a Director and the current President of the American Board of Otolaryngology is also a Past-President of both the Association of Academic Departments of Oto-HNS and the Society of University Otolaryngologists, and he was an elected member of the Board of Directors of the American Academy of Otolaryngology - Head & Neck Surgery (AAOHNS) from 2011-15. He is currently a member of the EENT Conditions Standing Committee for Quality Measures for the National Quality Forum, and is a member of the ACGME Residency Review Committee for Otolaryngology from 2016-22. Dr. Stewart is also the Founder and Medical Director of the Center for the Performing Artist at NewYork-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell, which is a multidisciplinary center caring for the musical needs of singers, musicians, dancers and other performers.

Dr. Stewart's research interest is in outcomes and quality of life research, and he has received research funding from the NIH and AHRQ among others. Dr. Stewart has received many awards and honors, including two Distinguished Service Awards and a Presidential Citation from the AAO-HNS. He has been a visiting professor at more than 40 institutions, and has given more than 400 invited lectures, both nationally and internationally.
