The Open Medical Institute (OMI) is a global educational initiative. Established by the American Austrian Foundation (AAF) and doctors from Weill Cornell Medicine in 1993, it bridges the knowledge gap between East and West, North and South and prevents brain drain from countries in transition.

SEMINARS

The OMI Seminars are the first step in OMI's postgraduate educational program. The seminars are taught by physicians from leading American and European hospitals and their affiliated medical schools and are directed to mid-career level, English speaking physicians practicing in Central and Eastern Europe, Asia, Africa, Latin America and other countries in transition. The selection of applicants is based on open competition and merit. Once accepted, fellows are invited to Schloss Arenberg in Salzburg to participate in a one-week seminar and meet with an internationally renowned American and European faculty to exchange knowledge and experiences. Each seminar is limited to a maximum of 36 participants, allowing for intense interaction through lectures, discussions, case presentations and hands-on trainings.
